The Organization

Since 2018, Elements Learning Collaborative(ELC), a 501 (c)(3) Non- Profit Organization, provides Summer Elements Nature Camp for children ages 4-10. Our mission is to provide children of diverse backgrounds with holistic, joyful and child-centered learning experiences in nature; ones that foster social and emotional development as well as responsibility and independence. Summer Elements is a healthy, enriching, and fun nature based youth day camp that takes place at Round the Bend Farm: A Center for Restorative Community (www.roundthebendfarm.org), in South Dartmouth, MA. Using the natural setting of the farm, fields, and nature trails we provide a holistic learning approach where the curriculum is based on child-led interests as well as local ecosystems, healthy movement, food systems, art, literature, mathematics, science, music & social thinking. Both counselors and campers have the opportunity to explore learning and teaching through hands-on project based learning in the gardens, with the livestock, and in the surrounding natural ecosystems. In addition to Summer Elements, ELC also offers a year-round school alternative for homeschooled children, parent-child programs, parent support, and a downloadable nature-based curriculum. All ELC programs are licensed by the Dartmouth Board of Health.

Youth Camp Counselor - Assistant Learning Guide

Youth Camp Counselors must:

- Be at least 15 years old.
- Have some experience providing care for children (ex: babysitting, volunteering with a youth program, childcare facility, supporting younger family).
- Be able to guide activities, games, and short lessons clearly.
- Be comfortable reading to or working with small groups of 3-4 campers.
- Pass a CORI & SORI check.
- Complete a 2-hour online safety training and a 1-day staff training.

Job Responsibilities:

Responsibilities to the Directors:

- Be familiar with the program policies and staff handbook.
- Assist in supervising the children, while maintaining a harmonious group with safe child to staff ratios.
- Encourage the children to be independent. Provide assistance only when needed and in a manner that guides the learner to develop their social & life skills.
- Model for them appropriate manners, conversations, and behaviors at all times.
- Always be available to offer gentle verbal or physical support and a pause when a child is struggling; with gear, with friends, with missing a parent, etc.
- Inform the lead guide and/or director of any difficulties within the program, including camper behavior, health, and the repair and maintenance of materials/ equipment.

Responsibilities to the Children and Parents:

- Respect the child and their individual learning styles, and development.
- Be patient and calm when children are struggling with difficult behaviors.
- Engage in age appropriate conversations with campers.
- Keep families' personal, financial, and health information confidential.
- Share all pertinent information about children's health and wellness with a Director.

Responsibilities to the Learning Environment:

- Clean and tidy workspaces after use, ensuring assistance from children involved.
- Providing the children with a "prepared environment".
- Keep the learning area inviting and relevant to the children's interests.
- Actively include children in keeping themselves and the space neat and clean throughout the day.
